NIUE TRAVEL ADVISORY #16 2022 COVID-19 (NOVEL CORONAVIRUS)

28th July 2022

No.16

1. ALL persons may enter Niue subject to the following conditions:

- i. Declare, and provide evidence that he/she is legally allowed to travel to Niue;
- ii. **Declare and provide evidence that he/she have resided in an approved country for a continuous period of at least 14 days immediately before their journey to Niue commenced;**
- iii. Declare and provide evidence that he/she is fully vaccinated for COVID-19 in line with the vaccines approved (Annex 1) or a Vaccine Certificate for International Travel;
- iv. Those under the ages of 3 years are exempt from pre-departure testing;
- v. Those under the ages of 16 years are not required to provide proof of vaccination ⁽¹⁾;
- vi. Must provide evidence of a negative COVID-19 PCR test result **which must be completed in the “list of approved countries”** (Annex 2), and at most 48 hours before departure.
- vii. Declare and provide a Certificate of Recovery if you have had Covid19 in the last 3 months prior travel to Niue **whereby a pre-departure test will not be required.**
- viii. **Transits are ONLY allowed from any country in the “list of approved countries”.** Application for special consideration must be submitted in writing to the Chief Immigration Officer.
- ix. Vaccination exemptions may be granted on ‘**exceptional circumstances only**’.
- x. Provide evidence of travel insurance that include costs for a medical evacuation if he/she is a non-resident of Niue and essential workers;
- xi. All passengers are required to complete the Niue Travellers Declaration Form at www.covid19.gov.nu and receive a Travel Pass for entry into Niue;
- xii. Failure to get a Travel Pass may result in denial of travel to Niue.

2. Passengers who are NOT vaccinated or fail to comply with the conditions in paragraph 1 will be unable to travel to Niue. ⁽²⁾

3. A special exemption is granted for medical evacuation flights, freight vessels, patrol boats and military vessels.

4. Entry to **ALL** yachts, cruise ships, and other sea vessels are still **NOT** permitted with an exception to vessels mentioned in paragraph 3 above and vessels in emergency and distress.
